
## **KISAN SAMPARK SUTRA (KSS)**


ICAR-Indian Institute of Water Management (IIWM), Bhubaneswar, Odisha organised "KISAN SAMPARK SUTRA (KSS)" on 21<sup>st</sup> December 2022 from 7.00 PM onwards in virtual mode. Through this program, for the very first time, ICAR-IIWM connected farmers from different States of the country *viz*. Odisha, Bihar, Chhattisgarh and Manipur. The objective of the program was to connect with farmers from different States of India on fortnight basis. The program included lectures of eminent Scientists/Experts from different disciplines, audio visuals, success stories, Scientist-Farmer interaction etc. relevant to agriculture besides fisheries and animal sciences. This will empower the stakeholders with advanced agricultural water management technologies leading to improvement in their livelihood.

While addressing the program Dr. Arjamadutta Sarangi, the Director of the Institute explained the objective of the program and appreciated the initiative.
